The Resources Regulator has developed a planned assessment program to conduct a review of safety management systems at Tier 3 quarries.

The assessment program will be conducted by mine safety inspectors during 2024/25.

Small mines - Tier 3 quarries

Safety management systems review

The Regulator's assessment program will focus on the review key elements that must be included within a safety management system including the systems, procedures, plans and other control measures that will be used to control risks to health and safety at the mine. The assessment review includes:

- statutory positions
- safety management systems
- emergency planning
- contractor management
- supervision
- training
- incident reporting
- plant and equipment standards

Considerations

Mine operators should consider the review of critical controls to prevent serious injury or death is included within the site safety management plans and associated documentation.
