The NSW Resources Regulator is seeking experienced and enthusiastic presenters for its annual Mining Engineering Managers Safety Seminar on 13 and 14 October.

### Share your ideas and knowledge

This is an excellent opportunity to share experience, insight and learnings with mining engineering managers (MEMs) from across the NSW mining industry. Presenters will need to deliver informative, educational and practical presentations.

As a guide, presentations should fall into the following categories, however each potential presentation will be assessed on its merit:

- WHS lessons learnt from significant incidents,
- WHS practices/standards improvement or innovation,
- WHS related technology update, advancement or emergence,
- WHS related educational material including WHS practices/standards, general management and mental wellbeing.

Presentations are not to include brand promotion or sales pitches.

### Presentation format

- Attendees will attend in person (no online option), however online delivery may be possible for speakers where travel restrictions exist. Presenters unable to travel to Australia will be able to present to the seminar virtually (Zoom).
- Length of presentations can be either 30 minutes or 60 minutes, inclusive of question time.
- Presenters are strongly encouraged to make use of audio-visual materials to ensure effective audience engagement and are encouraged to present in a way that gains audience participation. Case study formats are also highly encouraged.

Please advise early if you have specific presentation requirements.

### **Submit an expression of interest**

### **Application process**

All written applications will be reviewed by the NSW Resources Regulator's mining engineering inspectors. The individual applications and the overall mix of presentations will be used to determine what applications are successful. Successful applicants will be notified in a timely manner to allow for preparation to occur.
