Dangerous incident IncNot0040114 Open cut coal mine The operator of a dump truck smelled smoke in the cabin, activated the emergency stop button and exited the truck. There was a loud bang and the truck began to roll away. The unmanned dump truck travelled approximately 30 metres in an arc before coming to a stop. Initial investigation indicates a loose wire has shorted out the 24 volt supply to the dump-brake switch causing a fire behind the dash and ultimately causing the truck to move on the incline.

When activating the emergency stop in a dump truck, plant operators should also ensure that the park brake is applied before exiting the vehicle.







Dangerous incident IncNot0040099 Underground coal mine



A fall of roof occurred on the inbye side of a fault plane. The continuous miner was operating inbye approximately 60 metres. Operators were able to retreat past the fallen material under supported roof. Ventilation was not disrupted.

MSHA	Mine fatality - On Thursday 3 June 2021, a 42-year-old section foreman was fatally injured when he was hit by a shuttle car. The victim was struck when he walked into the path of a loaded shuttle car that was traveling to the dump point. Details
