### **Summarised incidents**

INCIDENT TYPE	SUMMARY	RECOMMENDATIONS TO INDUSTRY
Dangerous incident IncNot0035710	A tail pulley of a mains trunk conveyor catastrophically failed at an underground coal mine. The bearing seized resulting in heat and the pulley being partially ejected (2-3 metres) from the confines of the conveyor boot end. The incident was seen on the CCTV that monitored the conveyor transfer. The mine had live temperature monitoring and had completed monthly vibration inspections. No workers were in the vicinity when the incident occurred.	Mine operators should review maintenance procedures, including lifecycle management, in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendation. Where temperature monitoring is used, it should be confirmed that it is set to the correct level to warn (or trip) of an impending failure.





Serious injury IncNot0035748

While widening a longwall installation face at an underground coal mine, the cutter head of a continuous miner hit a mega bolt tail. The nut from the bolt hit a worker in the face. The worker suffered a fractured sinus bone and was treated in hospital.



Mine operators must assess the risk for tasks and consider the clearance required to operate equipment. The risk assessment must also consider where workers are located during the cutting cycle.

MinEx NZ	Truck tyre blow-out  A worker was washing down a dump truck at a wash pad when the truck experienced a rupture of the rear left-hand tyre involving the inside sidewall and bead.  Details

SafeWork NSW	Engineer crushed by reversing excavator  A 32-year-old engineer suffered multiple fractures and internal injuries on a road works construction site when he was crushed between a reversing excavator and a stationary light vehicle. He was transported by ambulance from the Bringelly site to Westmead Hospital where he underwent surgery.  Details
